Senate Concurrent Resolution 2

Senate Concurrent Resolution 2, introduced by Senator Hershman:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the Indiana department of transportation to rename the Washington Street Bridge on U.S. 24 in Monticello as the "Chief Master Sergeant Dean A. DuVall Bridge".

Whereas, Chief Master Sergeant Dean A. DuVall was born in Monon, Indiana, on September 4, 1945;

Whereas, He was the third of six children;

Whereas, The family moved to Buffalo, Indiana, in 1957, where Chief Master Sergeant DuVall attended Reynolds Elementary School and graduated from Buffalo High School, where he was an avid athlete, playing basketball and running cross country and track;

Whereas, Chief Master Sergeant Dean A. DuVall joined the Air Force on his 18th birthday and was deployed to South Vietnam where he was a member of the 4th Air Commando Squadron, Da Nang Air Base;

Whereas, Chief Master Sergeant DuVall's plane crashed in Laos on March 13, 1966, and he was designated as missing in action;

Whereas, Chief Master Sergeant DuVall served as an aerial gunner on the aircraft;

Whereas, The crash site was identified in 1997, and excavations began in 2010 and ran through 2014;

Whereas, Due to the explosions and fire of the crash, the passage of time, and the highly acidic soil of the area, Chief Master Sergeant DuVall's remains were never recovered;

Whereas, Although the excavation is closed, the DuVall family continues to search for answers regarding Chief Master Sergeant Dean A. DuVall; and

Whereas, Bravery and courage such as that displayed by Chief Master Sergeant DuVall must not go unrecognized: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly wishes to recognize the bravery and suffering of Chief Master Sergeant Dean A. DuVall in the defense of his country and the years of uncertainly his family has endured. As a way to honor this man and his great sacrifice, we urge the Indiana department of transportation to rename the Washington Street Bridge on U.S. 24 in Monticello as the "Chief Master Sergeant Dean A. DuVall Bridge".

SECTION 2. That copies of this resolution be transmitted by the Secretary of the Senate to the commissioner of the Indiana department of transportation and the family of Chief Master Sergeant Dean A. DuVall.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security & Transportation.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 3

Whereas, Many states, including Indiana, have designated and named portions of state or federal highways as memorials to those brave men and women who served their country so well in perilous times;

Whereas, The Korean War began on June 25, 1950, when President Harry S. Truman committed the United States military to a United Nations effort to stop North Korea's annexation of South Korea;

Whereas, Between June 25, 1950, and July 27, 1953, approximately 5,720,000 Americans served in the military, many of whom were stationed in Korea;

Whereas, The Korean War cost our nation dearly, taking more than 33,000 lives;

Whereas, The military personnel involved in this war sacrificed greatly for their country but received little thanks;

Whereas, The people of the state of Indiana and the city of Evansville wish to honor the Korean War veterans by erecting a memorial sign where the 38th parallel crosses Interstate 69, which is just north of Morgan Avenue; and

Whereas, It is fitting and proper that these brave Americans receive the recognition that they so justly deserve: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the service of Indiana veterans to our state and our nation during the Korean War be commemorated by urging the Indiana Department of Transportation to place a memorial sign where the 38th parallel crosses Interstate 69 just north of Morgan Avenue in Evansville, entitled "Veterans of the Korean War Memorial - 38th Parallel" in their honor.

SECTION 2. That a copy of this resolution be transmitted by the Secretary of the Senate to Don Gillies and the commissioner of the Indiana Department of Transportation.

Whereas, At the age of 13, Alicia Kozakiewicz was abducted by a "friend" she met on the Internet;

Whereas, Fortunately, Alicia was rescued by an FBI team with the expertise to follow clues through the Internet to find her location;

Whereas, Alicia has made it her mission to make sure help is available for all children who need rescue;

Whereas, Due to a lack of dedicated federal resources, less than 2% of known child exploitation cases are investigated;

Whereas, Alicia's Law is model legislation to provide child rescue funding for states by creating a dedicated revenue source for law enforcement units that combat child sexual exploitation;

Whereas, Successful legislative campaigns have been carried out in Virginia, Texas, Arizona, Hawaii, Idaho, California, Kentucky, and Tennessee; and

Whereas, In order to protect Hoosier children, the concept brought forth in Alicia's Law should be thoroughly studied: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the legislative council is urged to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of creating permanent funding of child rescue programs and funding investigations of Internet crimes against children.
