RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING

Senate Resolution 55

Senate Resolution 55, introduced by Senator Boots:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of whether IC 36-5-3-2 should be clarified to provide that towns may establish separate compensation scales for part-time and full-time town clerk-treasurers and other elected town officers, and accordingly

pay a lower compensation rate if a town official acts in a part-time capacity.

Whereas, Indiana Code (IC) 36-5-3-2 currently does not provide for a circumstance where town clerk-treasurers and other elected town officers may be paid on a part-time compensation scale if they initially desire to work in a part-time capacity only, or if they stop working in their full-time capacity after beginning to do so;

Whereas, A study should therefore be conducted on whether IC 36-5-3-2 should be clarified to allow towns to establish separate compensation scales for part-time and full-time clerk-treasurers and other elected town officers, and accordingly allow the town to pay a lower compensation rate if a town official acts in a part-time capacity;

Whereas, If this topic is assigned to a study committee, the topic of when a part-time pay scale may go into effect, such as in the middle of a year, should also be considered, as IC 36-5-3-2 currently provides that the compensation of an elected town officer may not be changed in the year for which it was fixed; and

Whereas, It is fitting and proper that this topic be assigned to a study committee to ensure the efficient and responsible use of taxpayer dollars: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the
General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate urges the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of whether IC 36-5-3-2 should be clarified to provide that towns may establish separate compensation scales for part-time and full-time town clerk-treasurers and other elected town officers, and accordingly pay a lower compensation rate if an official acts in a part-time capacity.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the legislative council.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

Senate Resolution 60

Senate Resolution 60, introduced by Senator Head:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging Governor Michael R. Pence to declare the third Saturday of September as American Indian Day.

Whereas, The annual Trail of Courage Living History Festival, which has been held on the third weekend of September since 1976, is an event that honors the Potawatomi who were forcibly removed from Indiana to Kansas in 1838, known as the Trail of Death;

Whereas, The Trail of Death took place September 4th to November 4th, 1838;

Whereas, Each year, the Fulton County Historical Society honors a different Potawatomi family that had ancestors on the Trail of Death or signed treaties in Indiana;

Whereas, At the 2016 festival, the organization will honor John "Rocky" Barrett, chairman of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, Shawnee, Oklahoma;

Whereas, While most of the descendants of the Trail of Death are members of the Citizen Band, some are members of the Pokagon Band of Michigan and Indiana, Prairie Band of Kansas, and Forest Band of Wisconsin, and each of these bands have given tribal flags to the Trail of Courage Living History Festival;

Whereas, In 1816, when Indiana became a state, northern Indiana was still Potawatomi Territory, and there are still many Potawatomi living in Indiana, as well as members of other tribes;

Whereas, Also notable, at least 10 percent of Indiana residents have American Indian ancestry; and

Whereas, In honor of 2016 being Indiana's Bicentennial year, the third Saturday of September should be declared American Indian Day, a permanent day of recognition and acknowledgment that American Indians were and still are important in Indiana's history and modern life: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate urges Governor Michael R. Pence to declare the third Saturday of September as American Indian Day.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to Governor Michael R. Pence and the Shirley Willard, President of the Fulton County Historical Society.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Public Policy.

Senate Resolution 63

Senate Resolution 63, introduced by Senator Breaux:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of enhancing the use of health information technology in Indiana.

Whereas, In 2014, the General Assembly passed SEA 44 (2014) which directed the state department of health and the office of the secretary of family and social services to establish a work group to study various health data issues and report their findings to the legislative council;

Whereas, The work group submitted their findings in a report, Enhancing the Use of Health Information Technology in Indiana;

Whereas, Included in this report are recommendations for potential legislative changes in the area of health data and health information technology; and

Whereas, It would be beneficial for the recommendations in this report to be studied by an interim study committee of the Indiana General Assembly: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate urges the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of enhancing the use of health information technology in Indiana.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Health & Provider Services.

House Concurrent Resolution 55

House Concurrent Resolution 55, sponsored by Senators Grooms, Becker, Smith, Perfect, Messmer, Houchin, and Tomes:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging the Indiana Department of Transportation to rename the East End Bridge across the Ohio River as the "Lewis and Clark Bridge".

Whereas, Lewis and Clark were one of the greatest teams of explorers in the world;

Whereas, Lewis and Clark were co-captains of America's most famous expedition;

Whereas, Captain Meriwether Lewis came down the Ohio River from Pittsburgh, Ohio, and met William Clark in October 1803 at the Falls of the Ohio;

Whereas, Captain Lewis hired expert pilots to navigate through The Falls of the Ohio, a series of long and dangerous rapids over limestone ledges in the Ohio River between Kentucky and Indiana;

Whereas, William Clark was living with his brother, General George Rogers Clark, founder of Louisville, Kentucky, in Clarksville, Indiana, on the north bank of the Ohio River in 1803;

Whereas, Lewis and Clark recruited, enlisted, and trained the leadership of the expedition known as the "Nine Young Men from Kentucky" at the Falls of the Ohio;

Whereas, The expedition members were sworn in at the home site of General George Rogers Clark;

Whereas, Over one third of the permanent members of the Corps of Discovery were from the Falls of the Ohio area; they were Joseph and Reuben Field, Charles Floyd, John Shields, Nathaniel Pryor, George Shannon, George Gibson, William Bratton, and John Colter;

Whereas, Lewis and Clark and their Corps of Discovery departed from the Falls of the Ohio at Mill Creek on the Ohio River to begin their expedition to the Pacific on October 26, 1803;

Whereas, Sergeant Charles Floyd, born in Kentucky but living in Indiana at the time he was recruited, was the only member of the expedition to die while on the expedition, dying on August 20, 1804;

Whereas, William Clark's slave, York, was the first African-American to cross the United States from coast to coast;

Whereas, On November 5, 1806, after three years, Lewis and Clark returned to Indiana and Kentucky from the Pacific as acclaimed national heroes;

Whereas, On November 8, 1806, upon returning from their historic expedition to the Pacific, Lewis and Clark visited Locust Grove, located a short distance south of the Ohio River in Louisville, Kentucky, the only verified remaining structure west of the Appalachian Mountains known as a stopping point for Lewis and Clark;

Whereas, Lewis and Clark later departed together from the Falls of the Ohio area to return to Washington and report to President Thomas Jefferson, but went by different routes;

Whereas, Colonel Meriwether Lewis Clark, Jr., Clark's grandson, was the founder of the Kentucky Derby;

Whereas, The National Council of the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial, the organization awarding Signature Events to 15 significant sites of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, was made aware of this little known fact and of the significance of Captain William Clark's descendants to the Kentucky Derby, a fact that played a large part in gaining national attention of the members

of the National Council of the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial to the Falls of the Ohio area; and

Whereas, The Falls of the Ohio was thus awarded the 2nd Signature Event of the National Lewis and Clark Bicentennial Commemoration held October 14-26 in Clarksville, Indiana, and Louisville, Kentucky, after 200 years of its history being ignored or almost forgotten: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly urges the commissioner of the Indiana Department of Transportation to rename the East End Bridge across the Ohio River as the "Lewis and Clark Bridge".

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit a copy of this resolution to the commissioner of the Indiana Department of Transportation.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security & Transportation.
