RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING

Senate Concurrent Resolution 45

Senate Concurrent Resolution 45, introduced by Senator Lanane:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Dr. Jo Ann Gora upon her retirement as President of Ball State University.

Whereas, Dr. Jo Ann Gora has served as President of Ball

State University since 2004;

Whereas, President Gora is the fourteenth president of the university, and the first woman to serve as president of a public university in Indiana;

Whereas, President Gora quickly demonstrated her commitment to putting students first by declining an inauguration and instead establishing a scholarship fund for 25 high-achieving students;

Whereas, President Gora led the development of Ball State University's "Education Redefined" strategic plan during its implementation from 2007 to 2012;

Whereas, Education Redefined's cornerstone was making immersive learning opportunities available allowing students to impact citizens from every Indiana county, leading to more than 20,800 students completing over 1,250 projects in the last six years while being mentored by faculty across every university academic department;

Whereas, During President Gora's tenure, Ball State saw more than \$520 million worth of campus renovations and facilities construction, including new dormitories, updates to Scheumann Stadium, upgrades to dining halls, and the opening of the David Letterman Communication and Media Building;

Whereas, President Gora commissioned the Geothermal Conversion Project, the nation's largest ground-source, closed-loop district geothermal system, which has created an estimated 2,300 jobs and cut Ball State's carbon footprint in half;

Whereas, Under the leadership of President Gora, fifty-four Ball State academic programs have earned national recognition;

Whereas, President Gora's steadfast commitment to improving Ball State and the local community has earned her many awards, including the Torchbearer, the highest honor from the Indiana Commission on Women;

Whereas, President Gora was named one of the nineteen most influential women in Indiana by the Indianapolis Business Journal;

Whereas, Other notable awards include the Vivian Conley Award for dedication to community contributions, the Walter S. Blackburn Award for her work promoting the Ball State University College of Architecture and Planning Indianapolis Center, and the Mira Trailblazer Award from TechPoint for

significant and lasting contributions to technology innovation in Indiana;

Whereas, President Gora has also written two books, was a charter member of the The New York Times/Chronicle of Higher Education cabinet, and served on numerous Boards and Councils, including the American Council on Education's Board of Directors, the Mid-American Conference President's Council, the Governing Boards' Council of Presidents, First Merchants Bank, Ball Memorial Hospital, the Indiana Chamber of Commerce, and was the immediate past chair of the Central Indiana Corporate Partnership;

Whereas, President Gora has made outstanding advancements in the academic and social foundations of Ball State University, and her departure will be greatly missed by students, faculty, and the local community alike: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. The Indiana General Assembly praises the exceptional work exhibited by Dr. Jo Ann Gora and congratulates her upon her retirement.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of the resolution to Dr. Jo Ann Gora.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 48

Senate Concurrent Resolution 48, introduced by Senator M. Young:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Clayton Christian Church on the occasion of its 150th anniversary.

Whereas, Clayton Christian Church was founded on Sunday, December 7, 1863 by Pastor Thomas Lockhart and 63 charter members for the purpose of fulfilling the Great Commission of Christ. The church was built in Clayton at a cost of \$2,600, and the parcel of land for the church was purchased for \$1;

Whereas, Pastor Lockhart was a key Christian leader and church planter in Hendricks County, Indiana, having played a part in establishing churches in Brownsburg, Clayton, Danville, Pittsboro, and Stilesville, and leading thousands to Christ;

Whereas, Despite the Civil War raging on at the time of its founding, followers of Clayton Christian Church were determined to bring God's peace to those nearby. The church has maintained its ministry in Clayton since that time;

Whereas, Over the past 26 years, the church has grown in many ways, and now the church has on staff two full-time

pastors, a three quarters-time director of music and arts, a part-time ministry assistant, and a part-time custodian;

Whereas, The focus of the church today remains the Great Commission. The active programs for children and students are a strength for the church and community, and the missions outreach provides \$40,000 per year to support missions that take the gospel message across the street and around the world;

Whereas, The ministry of the church has grown to the extent that in 2001, the church built and moved into a 13,800 square foot building as phase one of a master plan for facilities, with plans to add additional space with little or no lasting debt in order to continue increasing the church's ability to minister to its community, our culture, and our world;

Whereas, The vision of Clayton Christian Church is to create a place where lives are transformed by Jesus Christ. The mission of the church is to be a place where people connect others to God, grow in community, and serve with compassion; and

Whereas, By God's grace, the Bible will be the church's final authority, the church will be a holy people, will welcome all people, will be culturally relevant while remaining doctrinally pure, will be faithful stewards, and will do all things with excellence to the glory of God: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors Clayton Christian Church on the occasion of its 150th anniversary.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit copies of this Resolution to Gary Black, Lead Pastor.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 38

Senate Concurrent Resolution 38, introduced by Senators Wyss and Arnold:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION recognizing the Indiana State Police Alliance for 40 years of service to law enforcement and the public.

Whereas, The Indiana State Police Alliance was chartered March 19, 1974, to promote and assist its member Troopers and the Indiana State Police Department;

Whereas, The Indiana State Police Alliance is a voluntary membership organization consisting of 1,800 Troopers, retired Troopers, motor carrier inspectors, and capitol police officers who, for the past 40 years, have worked tirelessly to provide a safe and better working environment for Indiana State Troopers

and everyday Hoosiers;

Whereas, The Indiana State Police Alliance and its Cops for Kids Foundation, a not-for-profit organization formed in 1991, have promoted a respectful and educational relationship between children and Indiana State Troopers and have donated nearly \$1,000,000 to youth programs throughout the State of Indiana;

Whereas, The Indiana State Police Alliance, through its Trooper Scott Patrick Flag Fund, has provided a casket flag whenever any retired Indiana State Trooper dies or whenever any police officer, nationwide, is killed in the line of duty;

Whereas, The Indiana State Police Alliance is a member of the National Troopers Coalition and advocates and supports Troopers on a national level; and

Whereas, The Indiana State Police Alliance has been an advocate and supporter of all law enforcement officers in the State of Indiana: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly congratulates the Indiana State Police Alliance on the occasion of its 40th anniversary of service to law enforcement and the citizens of the State of Indiana.

Whereas, First Lieutenant Lewis Bennett Challis died a hero on August 25, 1944, while serving with the 12th Engineer Combat Battalion, 8th Division;

Whereas, First Lieutenant Challis was killed by a sniper while on patrol in France on Paris Liberation Day and was buried in the Brittany American Cemetery in St. James, France;

Whereas, After 69 years, First Lieutenant Lewis B. Challis is being awarded the Purple Heart, World War II Victory Medal, and the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with one Bronze Service Star in recognition of his gallantry in the line of duty;

Whereas, Born in Danzig, Germany (Gdansk, Poland) in 1913, First Lieutenant Lewis B. Challis was the son of Harold Bennett Challis, an American opera singer traveling in Europe;

Whereas, The Challis family escaped Germany in 1917, coming to Peru, Indiana, to live;

Whereas, First Lieutenant Challis attended Peru High School, where he was a member of the Honor's Society, Student Council, and "Narcissus" Yearbook Staff;

Whereas, After graduation, First Lieutenant Challis attended Purdue University, where he initiated in Phi Kappa Psi Fraternity and received a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering;

Whereas, First Lieutenant Challis enlisted in the Army on July 30, 1940, at Fort Sam Houston, Texas;

Whereas, Before leaving for duty overseas, First Lieutenant Challis married Jary Cleveland Challis on April 28, 1941;

Whereas, First Lieutenant Lewis Bennett Challis, like millions of other Americans who have answered their country's call, did not seek personal glory, but instead sought peace and freedom for the future generations of our country; and

Whereas, Bravery such as this deserves to be remembered always: Therefore,
