House Concurrent Resolution 66

Representative Ober introduced House Concurrent Resolution 66:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION congratulating the Central Noble High School girls basketball team.

Whereas, The Central Noble Cougars (23-5) girls basketball team fought back from a six-point halftime deficit to defeat Winchester High School 46-42 in the Class 2A state championship game at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, giving the school its first state championship in any sport;

Whereas, This victory for the Cougars was the first of the tournament over a ranked team; Winchester (26-3) came into the tournament ranked second in the final state 2A poll;

Whereas, The Central Noble Cougars fought their way back into the game behind the scoring of Sydney Freeman, who scored 11 of her team-high 14 points in the second half;

Whereas, Calista Rice was selected as the winner of the Patricia L. Roy Mental Attitude Award in Class 2A girls basketball by the members of the Indiana High School Athletic Association's Executive Committee;

Whereas, Calista Rice has been a varsity starter in soccer, basketball, and softball all four years of her high school career, has served as a captain in all three sports, and earned All Conference and All Area honors; and

Whereas, Outstanding accomplishments such as this deserve special recognition: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:

SECTION 1. That the members of the Indiana General Assembly congratulate the Central Noble High School girls basketball team on winning the Class 2A state basketball championship and wish the players continued success in all their future endeavors, both on and off the basketball court.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy of this resolution to each team member, manager, assistant coach, head coach Josh Treesh, athletic director Tyler Schuller, principals Greg Moe and Shawn Hoover, and superintendent Troy Gaff.

House Concurrent Resolution 65

Representative Ober introduced House Concurrent Resolution 65:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging all Hoosiers to recognize "Electric Lineman Appreciation Day".

Whereas, The profession of electric lineman is steeped in personal, family, and professional tradition and requires passion, dedication, a commitment to safety, and ongoing training;

Whereas, Electric utility workers are often first responders during storms and other catastrophic events, working to make the scene safe for our other public safety heroes;

Whereas, Across the Hoosier state, more than 1,600 men and women maintain more than 134,000 miles of line for electric co-ops, municipal electric utilities, and investor-owned electric utilities;

Whereas, Our nation depends on these dedicated individuals to construct and maintain the energy infrastructure of our state and our country;

Whereas, This has been an especially challenging year with historic weather events in Texas, Florida, and Puerto Rico, where Hoosier linemen and women have provided assistance;

Whereas, These situations often involve the interruption of family time at all hours of the day and night, including weekends and holidays;

Whereas, These dedicated individuals work in inclement weather and other challenging conditions to ensure the safe and reliable delivery of electric energy to our citizens; they are deserving of gratitude, appreciation, and honor; and

Whereas, It is appropriate to recognize the hardworking employees of all of our state's electric utility systems who work in the field and to especially note their efforts to restore power during outages in Indiana and provide assistance to other areas of our nation: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly recognizes Indiana's electric utility linemen and women for their dedication and commitment to keeping the lights on and keeping all Hoosiers safe.

SECTION 2. That the Indiana General Assembly urges all Hoosiers to recognize April 18, 2018, as "Electric Lineman Appreciation Day" in Indiana.

SECTION 3. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the local chapter of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW).

The resolution was read a first time and adopted by voice vote. The Clerk was directed to inform the Senate of the passage of the resolution. Senate sponsor: Senator Merritt.

Whereas, Representative Culver also started a number of nonprofit organizations, including Legacy Child, which helps families with adoption expenses; Shalom House, which assists in building homes for Mennonite World Relief; and New Harvest Ministries, which was a Christian teaching ministry for young adults and students in northern Indiana for 10 years;

Whereas, Representative Culver has resided in northern Indiana since 1960 and was raised on a duck farm in Middlebury, Indiana, where he was instilled with the values of hard work, personal responsibility, family, frugality, and service to others;

Whereas, Representative Culver is a member of the World Missionary Press Board and has twice taken three-year periods away from his business to serve as a pastor;

Whereas, Representative Culver is married to his wife, Val, with whom he has three children, Craig, Chelsea, and Cydney; and

Whereas, Representative Wes Culver has served his constituency loyally and faithfully since his election to the Indiana House of Representatives: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives bids a fond farewell to Representative Wes Culver. The House of Representatives has seen only good things during his tenure.

Legislators and staff alike will miss him greatly. His departure will leave a void that never will be truly filled.

Whereas, Representative Milo Smith has served his constituency loyally and faithfully since his election to the House of Representatives: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:

SECTION 1. That the date for the Second Regular Technical Session of the One Hundred Twentieth General Assembly is hereby fixed for Tuesday, May 15, 2018, at 1:30 p.m.

SECTION 2. The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate may issue a joint order that the General Assembly not convene in Technical Session if they determine that the cost and inconvenience of meeting in Technical Session are not justified
