## RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING

### Senate Concurrent Resolution 78

Senate Concurrent Resolution 78, introduced by Senator Grooms:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION memorializing J. Robert Shine and urging the Indiana Department of Transportation to rename a portion of State Road 64 the "J. Robert Shine Highway".

*Whereas, J. Robert Shine was born on November 1, 1923, in New Albany, Indiana, to Patty and Ira James Shine;*

*Whereas, Mr. Shine graduated from New Albany High School and received his bachelor of science with distinction from Indiana University, becoming a certified public accountant;*

*Whereas, Mr. Shine spent his career in public accounting at Monroe Shine & Co., Inc., building a strong reputation as a kind, intelligent, generous, and successful businessman;*

*Whereas, Mr. Shine was the past president and member of the Indiana CPA Society and a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants;*

*Whereas, Mr. Shine maintained a lifelong relationship with IU, served as a senior counselor of the Dean's Advisory Council of the Kelley School of Business, and was awarded the Distinguished Entrepreneur Award, an Honorary Doctor of Law degree, and the Chancellor's Medallion from the university;*

*Whereas, Mr. Shine spent many years serving Saint Meinrad Archabbey and School of Theology in various capacities, including his service on the Advisory Board of Abbey Press, the Board of Overseers, the Endowment Committee, and the Audit Committee;*

*Whereas, Mr. Shine attended monthly meetings with community leaders, business leaders, and young professionals throughout his life in order to find new ways to improve southern Indiana communities; and*

*Whereas, Mr. Shine gave freely of his time, talent, and knowledge to build strong communities in Indiana and in doing so secured his legacy as a mentor, friend, passionate volunteer, and organizer for action: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly urges the Indiana Department of Transportation to memorialize Mr. J. Robert Shine for his service to Indiana by renaming a portion of State Road 64 the "J. Robert Shine Highway" from the intersection of Dant Drive to the intersection of Tunnel Hill Road in Floyd County.

SECTION 2. That copies of this resolution be transmitted by the Secretary of the Senate to the family of Mr. J. Robert Shine and to the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Transportation.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Transportation.

### Senate Resolution 87

Senate Resolution 87, introduced by Senator Niezgodski:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of worker misclassification reporting by state agencies.

*Whereas, Worker misclassification occurs when employers incorrectly classify their workers as independent contractors rather than employees. This practice enables the employer to avoid making certain payments or benefits to the misclassified worker who is providing services. By misclassifying workers, employers may avoid paying unemployment taxes on wages and may also be denying worker's compensation and/or unemployment insurance;*

*Whereas, When employees are misclassified as contractors, they do not receive the essential employee benefits that they have rightly earned, which in turn has a negative financial effect on the individuals and their families;*

*Whereas, The negative effects of worker misclassification can go beyond just the individual. They allow some employers to tout inaccurate lower labor costs, which alters the conditions for a fair and competitive marketplace;*

*Whereas, The state of Indiana has an interest in understanding the state agencies' current practices regarding worker misclassification. Further investigating worker misclassification could provide Indiana with information such as current reporting practices and mechanisms for future reporting from state agencies. Being aware of specific details pertaining to the issue would contribute to the legislature's ability to properly address it; and*

*Whereas, The Indiana General Assembly has the ability to require reporting information from the State Department of Revenue, the State Department of Labor, the Worker's Compensation Board of Indiana, and the Department of Workforce Development. Having this information could contribute to the General Assembly's ability to craft substantive policy solutions. Indiana should do all that it can in order to protect its workers and ensure that employees are justly compensated for the services they provide: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the  
General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate urges the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of worker misclassification reporting by state agencies.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Pensions and Labor.

### Senate Resolution 89

Senate Resolution 89, introduced by Senator Jon Ford:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Indiana Department of Transportation to designate the pathway along the U.S. Highway 150 connector between Terre Haute and West Terre Haute as the Max Miller Memorial Pathway.

*Whereas, The Indiana Senate remembers Max Miller, a champion of Terre Haute and Vigo County and a gold standard for community volunteers;*

*Whereas, Max was born September 2, 1937, in Muncie to Gerald and Dorothy Miller and died June 11, 2018;*

*Whereas, Miller was a veteran of the United States Army, a proud Boilermaker of Purdue University, and a lifelong advocate for agricultural service and education, having served as a Purdue extension agent for 36 years in Vigo, Huntington, LaPorte, and Hamilton counties;*

*Whereas, Miller was deeply committed to the advancement of Vigo County, having established Leadership Terre Haute, the Terre Haute Tomorrow Committee, a Master Plan for the community, and the Wabash River Development Committee. He chaired the Action Team for Community Appearance and Natural Environment and helped initiate the city's trail system, Trees, Inc., Keep Terre Haute Beautiful, the Vigo County Park System, Pioneer Days, the Wabash River Initiative, and the creation of a 7,000-acre wetlands in the community;*

*Whereas, Miller led the growth of Vigo County's parks system from about 100 acres to more than 1,000 acres and personally handled the acquisition of 2,600 acres of floodplain along the Wabash River to create the Wabashiki Fish & Wildlife Area;*

*Whereas, Miller's community involvement also extended to several boards and committees that included the Hamilton Center Hospital Board, Wabash Valley Fair Board, Vigo County Park Board, Terre Haute Children's Museum, Vigo County School Corporation, Washington, D.C., Chamber of Commerce Legislative Committee and international agricultural training missions to Russia, Poland, and Slovakia;*  
*and*

*Whereas, Max Miller's legacy as a mentor, friend, passionate volunteer and organizer for action is an inspiration to all community leaders: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the  
General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate urges the Indiana Department of Transportation to designate the pathway along the U.S. Highway 150 connector between Terre Haute and West Terre Haute as the Max Miller Memorial Pathway.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit copies of this resolution to Max Miller's three daughters: Carmen Manning, Brenda Pomfret, and Karen Foster, and to the Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Transportation.

##### Senate Concurrent Resolution 79

Senate Concurrent Resolution 79, introduced by Senator Freeman:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Gary Johnson for 40 years in ministry and upon his transition from Lead Servant of Indian Creek Christian Church to Executive Director at e2: effective elders.

*Whereas, After 40 years of ministry and 30 years serving the congregation of Indian Creek Christian Church, better known as The Creek, Gary Johnson is transitioning to serve the ministry in new ways;*

*Whereas, Gary grew up in Michigan, and his grandmother Mary's faith was a powerful influence on Gary;*

*Whereas, Gary graduated from Olivet College with a B.A. in business, and Gary attended Lincoln Christian Seminary, graduating with a Master of Arts in church history, while working part-time as a teller and preaching at Waynesville Christian Church;*

*Whereas, Gary also holds Master of Ministry and Master of Divinity degrees from Cincinnati Bible Seminary, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Grace Theological Seminary;*

*Whereas, In his time as Lead Servant (Senior Minister) of The Creek since 1990, Gary has helped lead the church through periods of significant growth, from 250 individuals to more than 4,500 in weekly worship today;*

*Whereas, Under Gary's leadership The Creek has partnered with local organizations such as Lifebridge Community, Thomas Gregg School, Bethany Christian Services, Shepherd Community*

*Center, FAME, and many others to provide countless volunteer hours and service to the greater Indianapolis community;*

*Whereas, When not preaching at The Creek, Gary has completed more than 100 mission trips to encourage and equip church leaders in cross-cultural settings, taught as an adjunct professor for Cincinnati Christian University, Maritime Christian College, and TCM Institute, and Gary regularly speaks at conferences, events, and seminars concerning elder issues;*

*Whereas, After stepping down as Lead Servant of The Creek on April 28, Gary will continue his ministry by leading e2: effective elders, which provides teaching and training for elders in local churches; and*

*Whereas, Gary will continue to devote his life to Jesus Christ while spending time with his wife of 40 years, Leah, their two sons, Jared and Aaron, and their six grandchildren: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors Gary Johnson for 40 years in ministry and upon his transition from Lead Servant of Indian Creek Christian Church to Executive Director at e2: effective elders.

*Whereas, A strong advocate for public safety and law enforcement personnel, Marilyn served on the Public Safety and Criminal Justice Committee, and because of her background in finance, Marilyn served on the Administration and Finance Committee, serving for a time as Chair of the Committee;*

*Whereas, Additionally, Marilyn served for a time as Vice President of the City-County Council, and has served on various commissions and boards throughout her tenure;*

*Whereas, In her limited free time, Marilyn volunteers as a court-appointed child advocate, coordinates an annual job fair, mentors students in the Wayne Township Schools, is actively involved in the formation and development of the Indy Gateway, and is actively involved in her church, the Speedway Lion's Club, and West Side Chamber of Commerce Board; and*

*Whereas, After serving her community with distinction for many years, upon retirement Marilyn will have more time to spend with her three children, five grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*
