RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING**House Resolution 1**

Representative Richardson introduced House Resolution 1:

A HOUSE RESOLUTION honoring George Kristo on his retirement as the executive director of the Hamilton County Council on Alcohol and Other Drugs.

Whereas, George Kristo and his wife, Linda, moved to Noblesville, Indiana, from Toledo, Ohio, in 1990 following a 32 year career with Blue Cross Blue Shield;

Whereas, Since arriving in Noblesville, George Kristo has made an enormous impact on the Hamilton County community;

Whereas, On January 2, 1996, George Kristo began his career in Noblesville as the executive director of the Hamilton County Council on Alcohol and Other Drugs, the first person to hold the position in a full-time capacity;

Whereas, For 22 years, George Kristo has headed the Council on Alcohol and Other Drugs with the simple but difficult mission of "reducing and preventing consumption of alcohol and the use of illegal drugs" by county youth;

Whereas, George Kristo's leadership on the council has produced a strong collaboration and cooperation among the Council's board members;

Whereas, During his tenure, the Council began the Traffic Safety Partnership, built a relationship with local schools, and annually collected and distributed thousands of dollars for Hamilton County;

Whereas, In addition to the incredible impact George Kristo has had on his community as executive director of the Council on Alcohol and Other Drugs, he also spends countless hours serving the community in other ways, including volunteering for the last 5 1/2 years at Riverwalk Village, serving as a board member for Habitat for Humanity, Main Street, and the Hamilton County Mental Health Association, and as a board

member for Youth As Resources, playing a pivotal role in bringing the organization to Hamilton County;

Whereas, George Kristo is a member of Our Lady Of Grace Church and cleans the church every weekend;

Whereas, The greatness of George Kristo lies in the fact that most people will never know about the majority of his contributions to the community because that is the way George wants it;

Whereas, George Kristo's servant's heart and willingness to help others have made George Kristo a person who will be remembered far into the future; and, in retirement, those same traits will remain and he will continue volunteering his time to organizations throughout Hamilton County: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the members of the Indiana House of Representatives wish to express their heartfelt gratitude to George Kristo for his years of dedicated service to the Hamilton County Council on Alcohol and Other Drugs, his community, and his state.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy of this resolution to George Kristo and his family.
