RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING

Senate Concurrent Resolution 74

The Speaker handed down Senate Concurrent Resolution 74, sponsored by Representatives Speedy, Frizzell, Kirchhofer and Behning:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION recognizing Perry Township Schools on receiving the 2019 National Award of Excellence for Educator Effectiveness by the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching ("NIET").

Whereas, Perry Township Schools is the 2019 recipient of the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching's National Award of Excellence for Educator Effectiveness, the first recipient of this award in the United States;

Whereas, Since 2010, Perry Township Schools has partnered with NIET to raise student achievement by putting teacher leaders at the forefront of school improvement;

Whereas, Perry Township Schools educates 16,300 students representing 67 countries and 72 languages, including 3,174 refugees, and Perry Township Schools is the second fastest-growing school district in Indiana;

Whereas, Perry Township Schools represents the highest percentage of English language learners in Indiana, with 4,838 students who do not use English as their first language, and 47% of Perry Township Schools' English language learners read at Level 5 proficiency, the highest proficiency level according to the World-Class Instructional Design and Assessment;

Whereas, Between the 2015-2016 and 2017-2018 school years, Perry Township Schools' ISTEP pass rate increased from 49.1% to 51.3%, exceeding the overall State of Indiana pass rate;

Whereas, Perry Township Schools' high school graduation rate increased from 92.3% in the 2014-2015 school year to 95.2% in 2016-2017, exceeding the State average each year; and

Whereas, Receiving the 2019 NIET National Award for Excellence for Educator Effectiveness demonstrates Perry Township Schools' commitment to raising student achievement and deserves recognition: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the Senate

the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly recognizes Perry Township Schools on receiving the 2019 National Award of Excellence for Educator Effectiveness by the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 76

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Hadley Hawkins for winning the 2018 Indiana State Youth of the Year Award.

Whereas, Hadley Hawkins received the 2018 Indiana State Youth of the Year Award as a representative of the Lawrence County Boys and Girls Club;

Whereas, Hadley received a \$5,000 scholarship and is the first state Youth of the Year winner in the history of the Lawrence County Boys and Girls Club;

Whereas, Hadley now has the chance to compete for a \$10,000 scholarship in the Youth of the Year regional

competition that takes place in Chicago in July 2019;

Whereas, The Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence County serves more than 300 kids a day and is dedicated to improving the lives of their community's children;

Whereas, The Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence County has helped Hadley overcome her childhood speech delay and autism by giving her and kids like her a place to socialize and flourish;

Whereas, Hadley plans to attend Martin University in Indianapolis in the fall to study elementary education and join the school's speech and debate team; and

Whereas, Hadley's ambition to pursue a teaching career was largely shaped by her time spent at the Boys and Girls Club of Lawrence County: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the Senate

the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors Hadley Hawkins for winning the 2018 Indiana State Youth of the Year Award.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 77

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION recognizing the Indiana Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs Indiana Kids program.

Whereas, Since 2006, the Indiana Alliance of Boys and Girls Club has operated the Indiana Kids program, which provides education, youth development, and career exploration services to Indiana children and youth;

Whereas, Based on the Boys and Girls Clubs of America's POWER Hour program, the Indiana Kids program focuses on improving proficiency in reading and math;

Whereas, Participation in the Indiana Kids program enables Boys and Girls Club members to develop the daily habit of completing homework in a safe, quiet, and supportive atmosphere, and provides a safe environment during the hours when children and youth are most apt to participate in at-risk behaviors;

Whereas, Program participants are also offered career exploration activities, including job readiness, field trips, and career professional guest speakers, while also completing community service projects;

Whereas, The Indiana Kids program also focuses on teen initiatives, focusing on building education and career skills and knowledge to prepare Indiana's youth for life after high school; and

Whereas, Since the program's inception, Indiana Kids has served over 60,000 children and teens, enriching program participants' educational progress and life goals: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the Senate
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,
the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly recognizes the Indiana Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs Indiana Kids program.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to Lana Taylor, Executive Director of the Indiana Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs

House Resolution 72

Representative Frizzell introduced House Resolution 72:

A HOUSE RESOLUTION honoring the 40th anniversary of the Indiana-Taiwan sister-state relationship.

Whereas, The Indiana House of Representatives is proud of the sister-state relationship between Indiana and the Republic of China (Taiwan), including strong bilateral trade, tourism, and educational and cultural exchanges with Taiwan since 1979;

Whereas, The United States is the second largest trading partner with Taiwan, and Taiwan is the eleventh largest trading partner with the United States;

Whereas, Bilateral trade between the United States and Taiwan reached \$68.2 billion in 2017;

Whereas, The United States Congress passed the landmark Taiwan Relations Act (TRA) in 1979 to sustain a close bilateral relationship between the United States and Taiwan;

Whereas, The TRA advances mutual security and commercial interests and serves as the cornerstone of U.S.-Taiwan relations, helping to preserve peace and stability in the Taiwan Strait;

Whereas, Taiwan and Indiana have enjoyed a long and mutually beneficial relationship with the prospect of future growth;

Whereas, \$195 million of Indiana goods were exported to Taiwan in 2017, making it the seventh largest Asian export market for Indiana;

Whereas, Negotiating a bilateral investment agreement and a free trade agreement between Taiwan and the United States is an important step toward further strengthening bilateral trade between the United States and Taiwan, increasing Indiana's exports to Taiwan, and creating bilateral investment and technical collaboration through tariff reduction and other trade facilitation measures; and

Whereas, Taiwan shares the same values of freedom, democracy, human rights, the rule of law, peace, and prosperity with the United States and Indiana: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives honors the 40th anniversary of the Indiana-Taiwan sister-state relationship.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit copies of this resolution to Eric Huang, Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Chicago, Illinois.

House Resolution 73

Representatives Pryor and Summers introduced House Resolution 73:

A HOUSE RESOLUTION recognizing Christ Missionary Baptist Church of Indianapolis on the occasion of its 100th anniversary.

Whereas, The Christ Missionary Baptist Church celebrates its 100th anniversary in service to the Indianapolis faith community and greater Indianapolis area;

Whereas, The Christ Missionary Baptist Church was founded by a small group of people who held services from house to house in 1919 after being inspired by the Reverend B.J.F. Westbrook of Second Baptist Church in Indianapolis;

Whereas, The Christ Missionary Baptist Church has been led by eight pastors over the last 100 years with the Reverend John E. Girton, Jr., serving his community since 2015;

Whereas, Pastor G., as he is known throughout the community, was born into and baptized at Christ Missionary Baptist Church when he was seven years old and continues to build upon a rich legacy of faith, community activism, and outreach;

Whereas, The members of the Christ Missionary Baptist Church continue in service to their Lord and Savior Jesus Christ at 1001 Eugene Street in Indianapolis and will celebrate their 100th anniversary on August 19, 2019; and

Whereas, The members of the Christ Missionary Baptist Church continue to build upon their faith community by meeting the needs of their members and reaching Hoosiers "one soul at a time": Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives recognizes Christ Missionary Baptist Church for 100 years of service to its members, the City of Indianapolis, and the greater Indianapolis area.

Whereas, The women of the Junior League have raised millions of dollars in charitable contributions and donated tens of thousands of volunteer hours to start and support local programs that continue today, including Central Blood Bank, CASIE Center, Kidsfirst Children's Museum, Center for the Homeless, Alcohol & Addictions Resource Center, Children's Dispensary, and Hospice of St. Joseph County; and

Whereas, The Junior League of South Bend has nearly 500 members today, and offers women an opportunity to make South Bend a better place to live, while working with an educated, diverse, and passionate membership: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives recognizes the Junior League of South Bend, Inc. on its 75th anniversary that will be celebrated on June 20, 2019.

Whereas, The Tony Zamora Scholarship Fund grants annual scholarships to young jazz musicians graduating from local high schools to cultivate a love of jazz music in college and beyond, in collaboration with The Jazz Club and The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette; and

Whereas, Antonio and Betty Zamora champion a love for the deep creative expression of music that enriches the lives of performers and listeners alike: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
