*Whereas, The quality of the staff at ABC sets the center apart from other treatment centers;*

*Whereas, All of the employees are highly qualified and specialized within their particular field with all the therapists undergoing constant training and certification; and*

*Whereas, Applied Behavior Center for Autism provides the commitment and dedication needed to address the issues of autism and to develop a comprehensive plan to help those with autism: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

*Whereas, A large part of the credit for the successful year enjoyed by the Munster High School Science Olympiad team belongs to head coaches Keith Koszut and Patrick O'Neill, science teachers at Munster High School; and*

**RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING**

**House Resolution 63**

Representative Errington introduced House Resolution 63:

A HOUSE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of studying ways to improve Indiana's HPV vaccination rate for girls and boys of all races and ethnicities.

*Whereas, Approximately 250 Indiana women are diagnosed with cervical cancer each year and 85 cervical cancer-related deaths occur annually;*

*Whereas, Medicaid records for the seven-year period beginning January 2008 and ending December 2014 show that 5,975 cervical cancer cases were treated at a cost of \$4,285,127.38;*

*Whereas, In Indiana during the period from 2002 to 2011, African-American women had a 22 percent higher cervical cancer incidence rate and a 50 percent higher mortality rate than Caucasian women;*

*Whereas, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports that the human papillomavirus (HPV) is the primary cause of cervical cancer;*

*Whereas, The CDC also reports that HPV is a cause of other deadly cancers, including head and throat cancer;*

*Whereas, The incidence of HPV-related throat cancers in men is growing and is expected to surpass the number of cervical cancers within five years;*

*Whereas, A vaccine is available to prevent HPV in both men and women and thus prevent HPV-related cancers;*

*Whereas, Indiana's 2013 three-dose HPV vaccination rate for girls is 34.6 percent and 8.1 percent for boys, which is lower than the 2013 national average rates of 37.6 percent for girls and 13.9 percent for boys; and*

*Whereas, The CDC recommends routine HPV vaccination for all boys and girls 11 to 12 years of age and routine catch-up vaccinations for all girls 13 to 26 years of age and for all boys 13 to 21 years of age: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

SECTION 1. That the legislative council is urged to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of studying ways to improve Indiana's HPV vaccination rate for girls and boys of all races and ethnicities. The committee should issue to the legislative council a final report containing the findings and recommendations, including any recommended legislation concerning the topic.

The resolution was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Rules and Legislative Procedures.
