I am writing to inform you that Vigo County, Indiana (the "County") and the Vigo County Capital Improvement Board of Managers (the "CIB") are clients of the law firm of Kroger Gardis & Regas, LLP, where I am a partner. We currently represent the County and the CIB on numerous issues, including

the financing and construction of the proposed Terre Haute Convention Center. The County and the CIB are currently advocating for portions of the contents of Senate Bill 552. Although I do not have a direct personal or pecuniary interest in Senate Bill 552 as anticipated by House Rule 168, as I have participated directly in the legal representation of the County and the CIB, I believe it is in the best interest of the House of Representatives that I do not participate in proceedings regarding the bill. Therefore, I do not intend to preside when the bills are on Second or Third Reading, or during the adoption of any concurrence or conference committee report relating thereto, and I will ask to be excused from voting.

I have carefully considered this course of action and believe it is appropriate to safeguard the public's trust in the Indiana House of Representatives.
