(1) Whether the annual limit on the adjusted gross income tax credit for contributions to a college choice 529 savings plan under IC 6-3-3-12 should be modified in some way to allow a taxpayer to make greater contributions earlier in the taxpayer's schedule of savings.

(2) The implications of changes made by the federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (P.L.115-97) to the allowable uses of qualified tuition plans under Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C. 529).

(3) Whether the adjusted gross income tax deduction for education expenditures under IC 6-3-2-22 should be extended to expenditures made in connection with the enrollment, attendance, and participation in a public school elementary or high school education program.

(b) This SECTION expires January 1, 2019.

Whereas, Addison Agen was recently named the runner-up on season 13 of "The Voice";

Whereas, Addison Agen's "Voice" adventure began almost a year ago with a blind audition where the "Voice" coaches listened to performances with their backs turned to the stage, judging the singers only on their voices;

Whereas, Addison Agen convinced judges Miley Cyrus and Adam Levine to turn their chairs around with her rendition of "Jolene";

Whereas, After the blind audition, Addison Agen returned home to Fort Wayne before heading to Los Angeles to tape more elimination rounds;

Whereas, In a battle round, Addison Agen was eliminated from Cyrus' team, but Adam Levine brought Addison over to his team for the rest of the competition;

Whereas, Addison Agen advanced to the playoff round and secured a place among the season's top 12 contestants in the live episodes;

Whereas, During the live episodes, Addison consistently placed in the top 10 on iTunes, giving her vote totals a bump and helping her become one of the eight semifinalists;

Whereas, In the finals, each of the four contestants performed a cover, a new single, and a duet with their coach;

Whereas, During the competition, judge Adam Levine repeatedly called Addison Agen inspiring, especially to young women;

Whereas, Addison's mother, Kristine Agen, accompanied her daughter to California and remained with her during the entire stay;

Whereas, Addison started singing when she was only 4 years old and began songwriting when she was 11;

Whereas, Addison released her first album entitled "New Places" in 2016;

Whereas, During her young life, Addison Agen has accomplished great things; and

Whereas, Addison Agen is a model to all young people everywhere: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly expresses its heartfelt congratulations to Addison Agen on a job well done by appearing on "The Voice" television program and its sincere belief that Addison Agen has a future that is bright beyond belief. Whereas, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., dreamt of a better society where "the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners will be able to sit together at the table of brotherhood";

Whereas, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., believed that liberty, justice, and freedom were the "inalienable rights" to which all men, women, and children are entitled;

Whereas, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was a spiritual man who believed that all people are created equal in the sight of God and in the dignity and self-worth of every individual;

Whereas, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., gave his life defending his beliefs;

Whereas, The visions of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., continue to bring hope and inspiration to people of all nations;

Whereas, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., a recipient of the Nobel Prize, is a national hero whose birthday is celebrated as a day of peace, love, and understanding by a grateful nation; and

Whereas, All Americans must continue to gather inspiration from the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and strive to realize his dreams: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That it is fitting and proper that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., be remembered and recognized by future generations of Americans and that all citizens of Indiana honor Dr. King by living out his teachings as we continue to work toward a day when the dignity and humanity of every person are respected.
