HOUSE BILL No. 1208

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning civil procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 34-28-2-1.5 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 1.5. A person may not
3 petition for a change of name under this chapter if the person:
4 (1) is confined to a department of correction facility; **or**
5 (2) **was convicted of an offense listed in IC 11-8-8-5(a).**
