

HOUSE BILL No. 1575

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-30.

Synopsis: Lottery game for veteran programs. Requires the state lottery commission, in collaboration with a vendor contracted for a major procurement, to design or designate a scratch off game to benefit Indiana veterans. Distributes an amount equal to the surplus revenue received from the scratch off game equally to: (1) the Indiana department of veterans' affairs to make grants to provide services to veterans; and (2) county treasurers of counties operating veterans' courts.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

HOUSE BILL No. 1575

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 4-30-3-20 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2019]: **Sec. 20. (a) The commission, in collaboration with a
4 vendor contracted for a major procurement under IC 4-30-8 who
5 is assigned with responsibility for development and distribution of
6 lottery products and supporting sales, marketing, and promotional
7 efforts shall:**
8 (1) design a scratch off game; or
9 (2) designate a scratch off game;
10 to benefit Indiana veterans and dependents of qualified service
11 members (as defined in IC 10-17-12-7.5).
12 (b) Beginning January 1, 2020, the scratch off game described
13 in subsection (a) must be available to the public for play.
14 (c) Revenue from the sale of tickets for the scratch off game
15 described in subsection (a) must be distributed in the manner
16 required under IC 4-30-16.
17 (d) The commission shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2, including



1 **emergency rules in the manner provided under IC 4-22-2-37.1,**
 2 **necessary to carry out this section.**

3 SECTION 2. IC 4-30-16-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.127-2018,
 4 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 5 JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 3. (a) The commission shall transfer the surplus
 6 revenue in the administrative trust fund as follows:

7 (1) Before the last business day of January, April, July, and
 8 October, the commission shall transfer seven million five hundred
 9 thousand dollars (\$7,500,000) of the surplus revenue to the
 10 Indiana public retirement system for credit, as determined by the
 11 board of trustees of the Indiana public retirement system:

12 (A) first, to the pension stabilization fund established by
 13 IC 5-10.4-2-5, to be used as a credit against the unfunded
 14 accrued liability of the pre-1996 account (as defined by
 15 IC 5-10.4-1-12); and

16 (B) second, to one (1) or more of the supplemental allowance
 17 reserve accounts established under:

18 (i) IC 2-3.5-3-2(c) (for the legislators' defined benefit plan);

19 (ii) IC 5-10-5.5-4(c) (for the state excise police, gaming
 20 agent, gaming control officer, and conservation enforcement
 21 officers' retirement plan);

22 (iii) IC 5-10.2-2-2(a)(3) (for the public employees'
 23 retirement fund); or

24 (iv) IC 5-10.2-2-2(c)(3) (for the Indiana state teachers'
 25 retirement fund).

26 (2) Before the last business day of January, April, July, and
 27 October, the commission shall transfer seven million five hundred
 28 thousand dollars (\$7,500,000) of the surplus revenue to the
 29 treasurer of state for deposit in the pension relief fund
 30 (IC 5-10.3-11).

31 **(3) Before the last business day of January, April, July, and**
 32 **October, the commission shall transfer to the treasurer of**
 33 **state for distribution under subsection (c) an amount equal to**
 34 **the surplus revenue (as described by section 1(3) of this**
 35 **chapter) that was received by the commission from the**
 36 **scratch off game required by IC 4-30-3-20 since the last**
 37 **deposit.**

38 ~~(3)~~ **(4)** The surplus revenue remaining in the fund on the last day
 39 of January, April, July, and October after the transfers under
 40 subdivisions (1) ~~and (2)~~ **through (3)** shall be transferred by the
 41 commission to the treasurer of state for deposit on that day in the
 42 build Indiana fund.



1 (b) The commission may make transfers to the treasurer of state
2 more frequently than required by subsection (a). However, the number
3 of transfers does not affect the amount that is required to be transferred
4 for the purposes listed in subsection (a)(1) ~~and (a)(2)~~; **through (a)(3)**.
5 Any amount transferred during the month in excess of the amount
6 required to be transferred for the purposes listed in subsection (a)(1)
7 ~~and (a)(2)~~ **through (a)(3)** shall be transferred to the build Indiana fund.

8 (c) **The treasurer of state shall distribute the amount**
9 **transferred under subsection (a)(3) as follows:**

10 (1) **Fifty percent (50%) to the Indiana department of**
11 **veterans' affairs to make grants under IC 10-17-13.5-4 to**
12 **qualified entities to provide services to veterans.**

13 (2) **Fifty percent (50%) to the county treasurers of each**
14 **county operating a veterans' court described in**
15 **IC 33-23-16-10 according to the ratio that the population of**
16 **each county bears to the total population of the counties**
17 **operating a veterans' court at the time of the distribution.**
