House Resolution 46

Representatives Goodin, Lawson, Bartlett and Bosma introduced House Resolution 46:

A HOUSE RESOLUTION honoring Representative Steven R. Stemler.

Whereas, Representative Steven Stemler, who was elected to represent the citizens of House District 71 in 2006, will be leaving the House Chamber for the last time at the end of the 2018 session;

Whereas, During his time in the House of Representatives, Representative Stemler served on the Government and Regulatory Reform Committee, the Roads and Transportation Committee, the Statutory Committee on Ethics, and the Ways and Means Committee;

Whereas, As a member of the Ways and Means Committee, Representative Stemler persuaded members of the group, including Chairman Tim Brown (R-Crawfordsville), to include \$63 million in funding for the Ohio River Bridges Project and \$585,000 for the Falls of the Ohio State Park exhibits;

Whereas, During his time in the Indiana House of Representatives, Representative Stemler also authored House Enrolled Act 1211, which established the Transborder Water Resources Authority to monitor ownership rights of water resources, such as an aquifer, that are shared by Indiana and other states;

Whereas, For the past two decades, Representative Stemler has been involved in southern Indiana government and economic development, including serving as a director of the Southern Indiana Economic Development Council and the Jeffersonville Strategic Planning Committee and as chairman of the Southern Indiana Chamber of Commerce's Business Development Division;

Whereas, Representative Stemler served on the Indiana Port Commission from 1997 to 2006 and was instrumental in the development and growth of Indiana's three public ports located

in Burns Harbor, Mount Vernon, and the Clark Maritime Center in Jeffersonville;

Whereas, Representative Stemler is also currently serving as Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of Community Bank Shares of Indiana, Inc., is on the board of Your Community Bank of Southern Indiana, and served for five years on the River Ridge Commerce Center;

Whereas, From 1992 to 1995, Representative Stemler was a member of the Jeffersonville City Council, serving as council president in 1994, and was vice president of the Clark County Solid Waste Management District in 1994, as well as a past director of the Regional Federal Bank;

Whereas, Representative Stemler believes it is crucial that we all serve our community in various ways. Many of the boards and organizations he has been involved with through the years have been on a volunteer basis. Some of those organizations are the Greater Clark County Schools Community Facility Task Force Committee, the Childplace Board of Directors, the Falls of the Ohio Interpretive Center Development Committee, the Clark Memorial Hospital Advisory Board, Southern Indiana Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, Jeffersonville High School Parent Advisory Council, and the Jeffersonville Optimist Club;

Whereas, A native of southern Indiana, Representative Stemler is president and owner of The Stemler Corporation, which provides commercial and residential plumbing and irrigation services in southern Indiana and northern Kentucky;

Whereas, Representative Stemler is married to his wife, Vikki, and they have two children, a daughter, Mahalie, and a son, Lincoln; and

Whereas, Representative Steven Stemler has served his constituency loyally and faithfully since his election to the Indiana House of Representatives: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives bids a fond farewell to Representative Steven Stemler. The House of Representatives has seen only good things during his tenure. Legislators and staff alike will miss him greatly. His departure will leave a void that will never be truly filled.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit copies of this resolution to Representative Stemler and his family.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 50

The Speaker handed down Senate Concurrent Resolution 50, sponsored by Representatives May and Davisson:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION recognizing the Lawrence County, Indiana, Bicentennial.

Whereas, Lawrence County was organized shortly after the admission of Indiana to the Union and after being a part of Knox, Harrison, Washington, and Orange Counties;

Whereas, The first recorded settlement in Lawrence County was located on the eastern border of the county in Flinn Township, where Leesville currently stands;

Whereas, The Guthrie and Flinn families, skilled in the arts of pioneer life, hunting, fishing, and farming, were the first known settlers in the county in 1810, and have been named perpetually in the county history for their honor, courage, and self sacrifice after being attacked by the Pottawotamies;

Whereas, Lawrence County is named after the American Naval Captain James Lawrence, who is best known for his dying command, "Don't give up the ship!", which still remains a popular naval battle cry;

Whereas, Lawrence County is recognized as having the highest quality quarried limestone in the United States, and has since been named "Limestone Country" after outfitting landmarks across the country with Indiana limestone, including the Empire State Building, the National Cathedral, the 1930s buildings of Rockefeller Center, Chicago's Tribune Tower, the Pentagon, Biltmore Estate, Hotel Pennsylvania, the Indiana Statehouse and the new Yankee Stadium;

Whereas, Lawrence County is the proud hometown of three astronauts, including Gus Grissom, Ken Bowersox, and Charlie Walker, the first non-government individual to fly in space, who took sweetgum tree seeds on a space shuttle mission in 1984 to bring a piece of Indiana with him, returning to Earth with 200 germinated seeds that were later planted around Indiana and surrounding states;

Whereas, The Lawrence County Commissioners, former Indiana Lieutenant Governor Becky Skillman, and City of Bedford Director of Business and Community Development Director Marla Jones raised the official Lawrence County Bicentennial Flag on January 9, 2018, to begin a year-long Bicentennial celebration;

Whereas, For the Bicentennial, Lawrence County completed the Legacy Tree Project in collaboration with the U.S. Forestry Service, Indiana DNR, and local schools to provide a tulip poplar tree, State Tree of Indiana, and a space sweetgum tree to every school campus in the county;

Whereas, Lawrence County will conduct a fall Bicentennial Torch Relay patterned after the Olympic Torch Relay to pass through all nine Lawrence County townships by local residents who have demonstrated exceptional public service, excellence in their professions, acts of heroism, or volunteer service, in a route designed to unite county citizens and communities and to showcase locations of natural beauty, local interest, and historic significance in the county; and

Whereas, Lawrence County will be celebrating its Bicentennial throughout 2018 to honor the county's rich history, people, places, and culture, while charting a course for a brighter future: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the Senate
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,
the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly recognizes the Bicentennial of Lawrence County, Indiana.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit copies of this resolution to Lawrence County Bicentennial Commission members Becky Skillman and Marla Jones, and Lawrence County Commissioners Rodney Fish, Dustin Gabhart, and Gene McCracken

Senate Concurrent Resolution 48

The Speaker handed down Senate Concurrent Resolution 48, sponsored by Representatives Ziemke, Lyness and Frye:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring the St. Louis Catholic Church of Batesville, Indiana, on the occasion of its 150th anniversary.

Whereas, In 1867, residents of the City of Batesville pledged money to the construction of a Catholic church within city limits and began constructing the St. Ludwig's Catholic Church in 1868;

Whereas, Reverend John Paul Gillig was appointed as the Church's first pastor and in 1869, the Franciscan Priests of Oldenburg, Indiana, were asked to assume the Pastorate and then appointed the first Franciscan Pastor, Fr. Louis Haverbeck, O.S.F.;

Whereas, The first service and dedication of St. Louis Catholic Church took place on September 18, 1870, with the Very Reverend Otto Jair, O.S.F., presiding;

Whereas, St. Louis Catholic Church conducted masses in Latin, homilies, announcements, and prayers in German, and added an English homily in 1887;

Whereas, A school was erected at St. Louis Catholic Church in 1871, which today serves 420 students in preschool through eighth grade and continues to be a vibrant and integral part of parish life;

Whereas, Over its 150 years of service, St. Louis Catholic Church has been a leader in the spiritual, moral, and educational life of the Batesville community; and

Whereas, St. Louis Catholic Church is celebrating its sesquicentennial year in 2018, and events will be held throughout the year in celebration, culminating on October 28, 2018, with an anniversary mass and reception: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the Senate
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,
the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors and congratulates the St. Louis Catholic Church of Batesville, Indiana, on the occasion of its 150th anniversary.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit copies of this resolution to Father Stanley Pondo and members of the St. Louis Catholic Church Parish Council
